
Soldier Story: From Immigrant to the Medal of Honor

One of those recipients is Jose Rodriguez, an immigrant from Mexico who served in the United States Army during the Vietnam War. Rodriguez was born in Mexico City in 1948. He came to the United States with his family when he was six years old. He grew up in East Los Angeles and attended Roosevelt High School. After graduating from high school, Rodriguez joined the Army in 1968.

Rodriguez was assigned to the 101st Airborne Division and sent to Vietnam in 1969. He served as a machine gunner and was involved in some of the heaviest fighting of the war. On May 13, 1970, Rodriguez's unit was ambushed by a large force of North Vietnamese soldiers. 

of all ages.


